


Background on KEMRI

The Kenya Medical Research Institute (KEMRI) is a state corporation established through the Science and Technology (Amendment) Act of 1979, which has since been amended to Science, Technology and Innovation Act, 2013.

Scientific & Ethical Approval Process

- Have KEMRI scientists been included appropriately
- Does the protocol provide opportunity for formal/informal training of junior scientists? (note which)

Scientific & Ethical Approval Process

- Are the biological materials appropriate for answering the study questions

- Have all safety issues been addressed? (biohazard etc)
- Research with animals has this been approved by Animal Care & Use Committee (ACUC)

Highlights of the Nairobi RFI workshop. i) Challenges

- Lack of capacity for effective negotiations
- Inadequate information
- Matching upto partners who are skilful, have established scientific and legal procedures with dedicated offices
- Poor monitoring instruments of ongoing research
- Translation of research findings into policy



Highlights of the Nairobi RFI workshop. ii) Possible Roles of RFI

- Train Researchers in negotiation skills
- Help develop policies for engagement with local & external partners
- Assist to prioritise the research agenda
- Ensure joint ownership, outcomes & benefits
- Institutions can use the RFI audit to asses their own performance

Way Forward

- That RFI is not considered a "stranger" BUT a process to supplement and strengthen existing systems and regulations
- RFI considers all forms of collaborations/partnerships including Local, Regional, Continental, Global
- That there will be benefits of being a member
