 - Support for training and career development of researchers
 - Research for the benefit of specific groups – in particular, SMEs

International Cooperation in FP7

- FP7 open to international partners, with certain conditions
- International Cooperation taking place primarily through the 'Capacities' theme or through targeted actions (specific international cooperation actions)
- Top international partners from BRICS + USA
- Top sub-Saharan African partners from: South Africa, Kenya, Ghana, Tanzania

Africa in FP7

- Examples of FP7 Projects with Africa
 - CAAST-Net & CAAST-Net Plus – Coordination & support for bi-regional S&T cooperation
 - ERAfrica – ERA-Net for Africa
 - EuroAfrica ICT – Supporting bi-regional cooperation on ICT
- Examples of research projects:
 - EAU4Food – increasing food production in irrigated farming systems in Africa
 - Afromaison – tools & strategies for natural resource management
 - Africa Build – building a research and education infrastructure for Africa

2010 Coordinated Call for Africa

- Large-scale Call, targeting bi-regional research consortia
- Focus on “Water and Food Security” and “Better Health for Africa”
 - Joint call between 3 directorates: Health; Food, agricultures and biofisheries, and biotechnology; and Environment (including Climate Change)
 - 26 projects funded, with partners from 42 different countries

National Contact Points in FP7

- National Contact Points (NCPs) give personalized help and advice on FP7 to those intending to participate
- NCPs nominated by relevant national authorities to the EC via the ministries of foreign affairs of the host countries
- Third Country NCPs were strongly encouraged
- Africa:
 - 97 people acting as 126 NCPs
 - NCPs in sub-Saharan Africa: Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Cap Verde, Ethiopia, Ghana, Kenya, Lesotho, Senegal, South Africa, Uganda
 - Most NCPs in Health (10)
