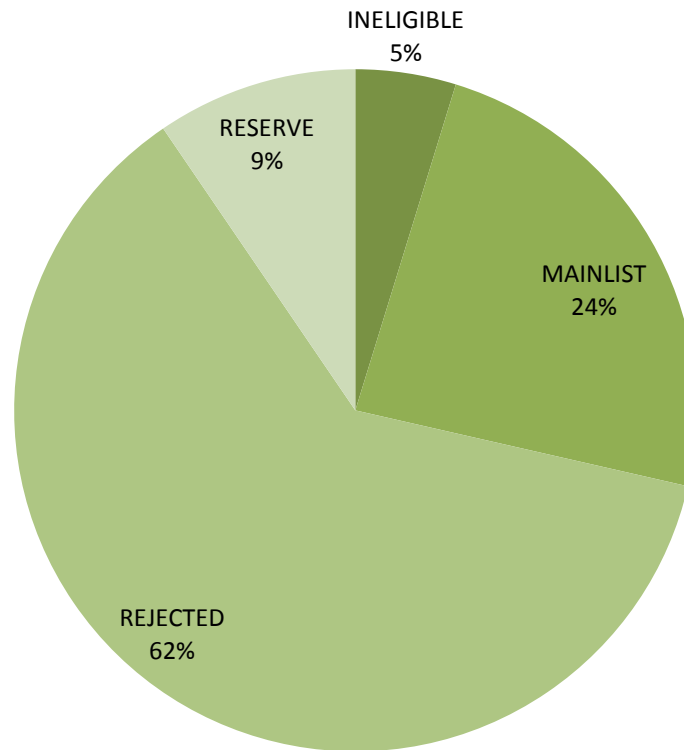
Malawi in FP7

- Malawi is the 16th most successful African country in FP7 in terms of numbers of participations in projects

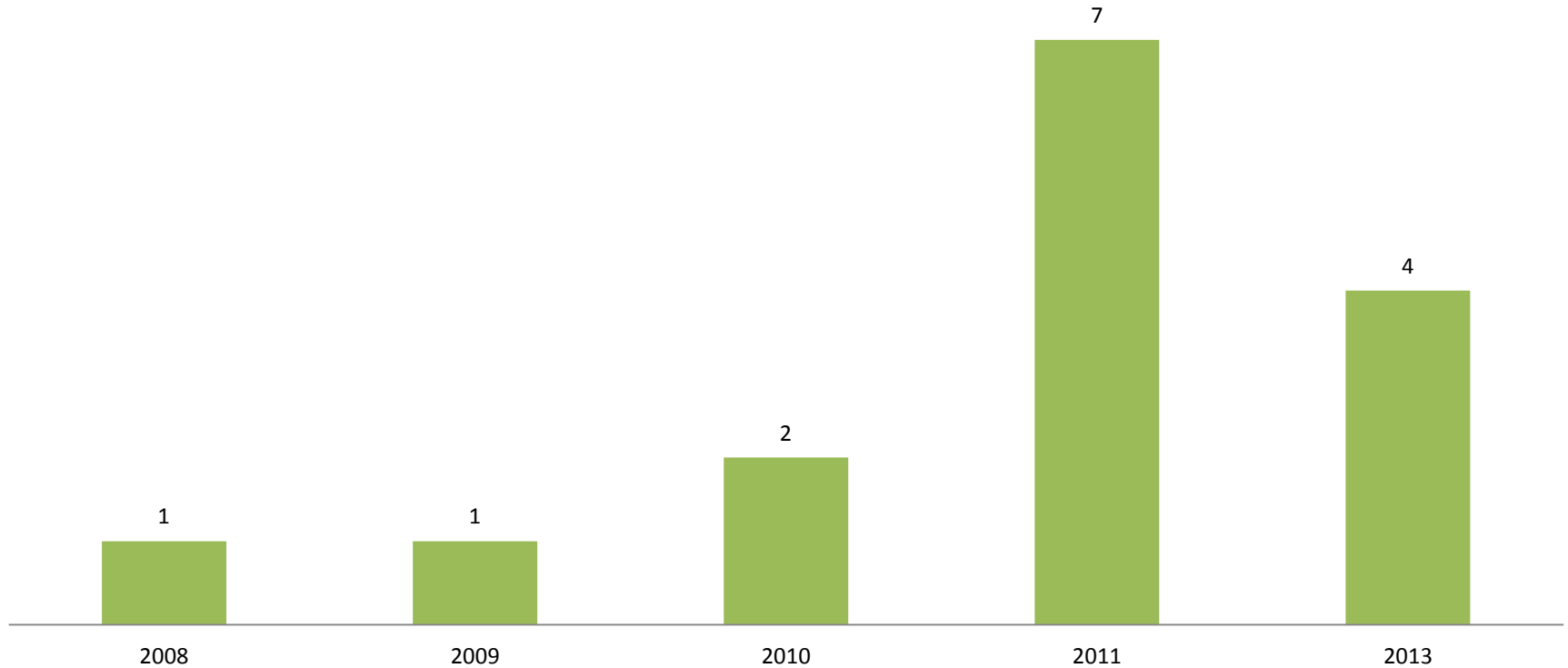

Evolution over time (2007-2013) for successful projects



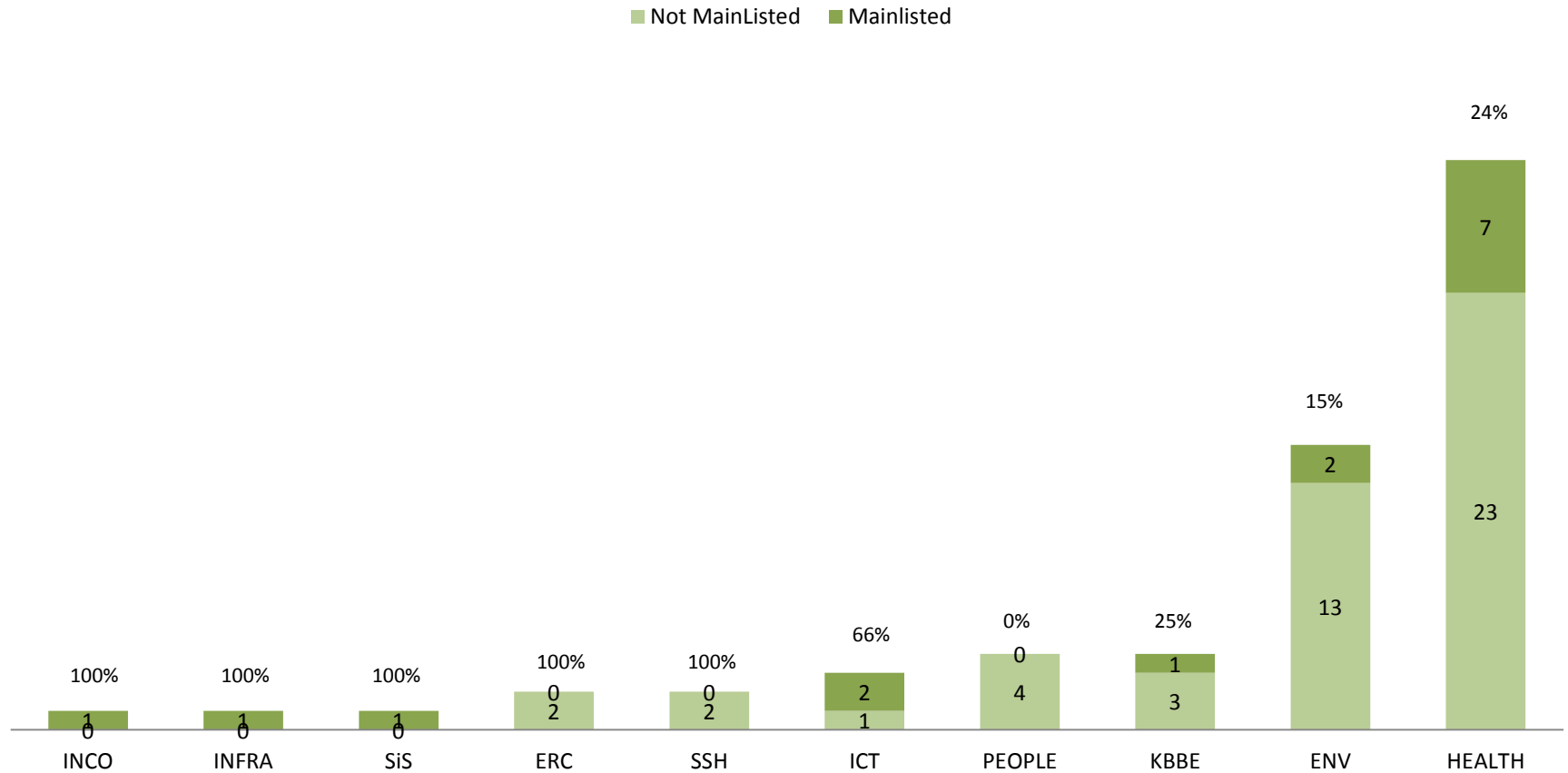

Most prominent themes



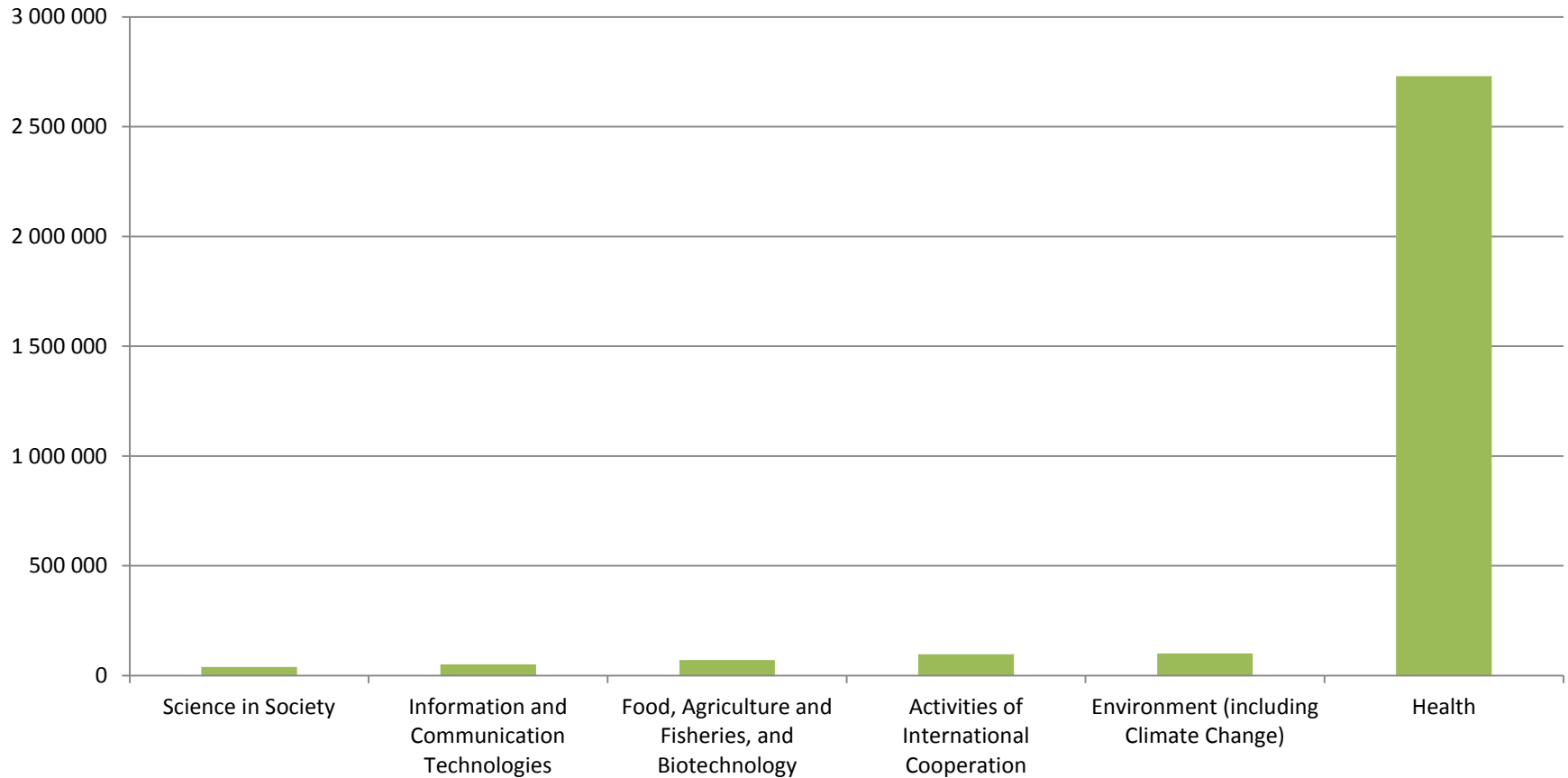

Proposal success rate per theme



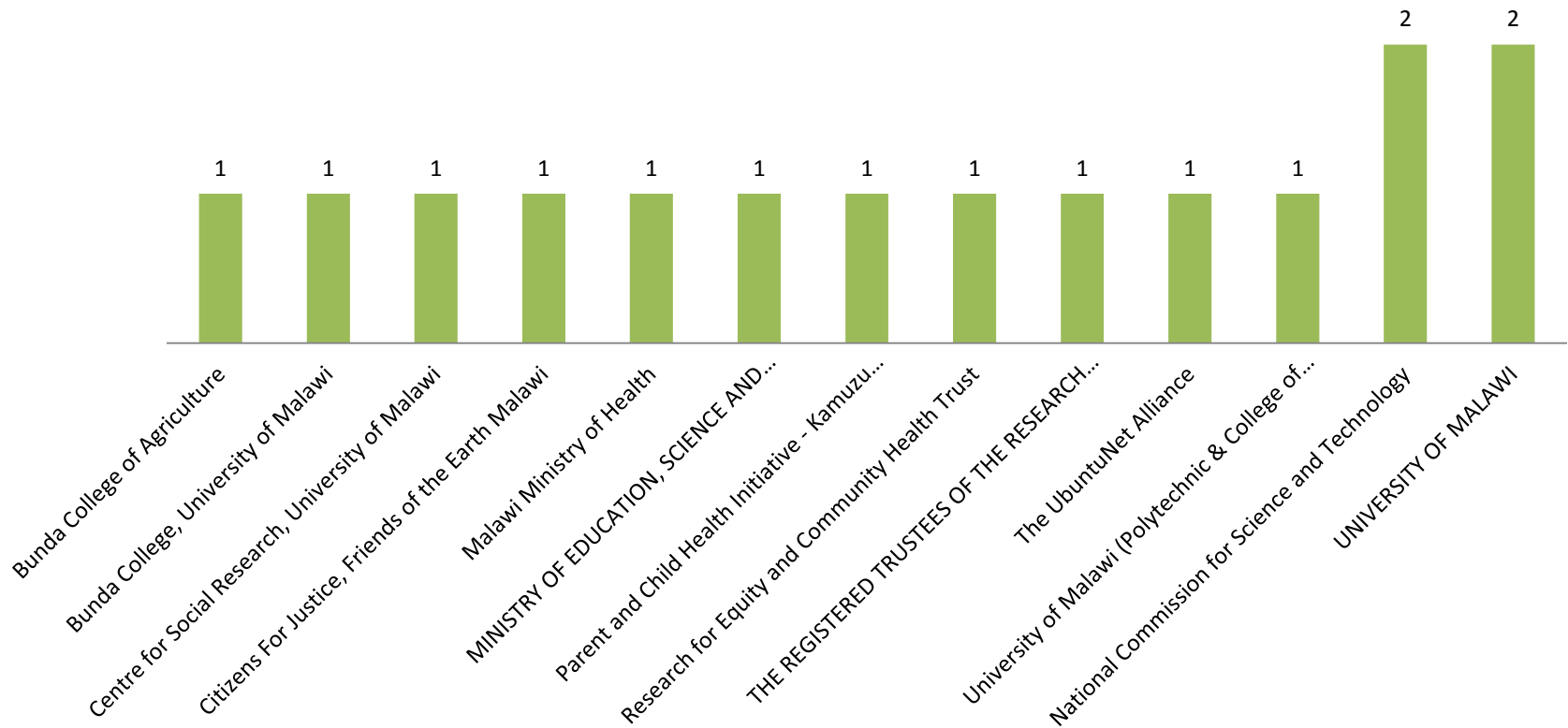

EC Contribution per theme for Malawi



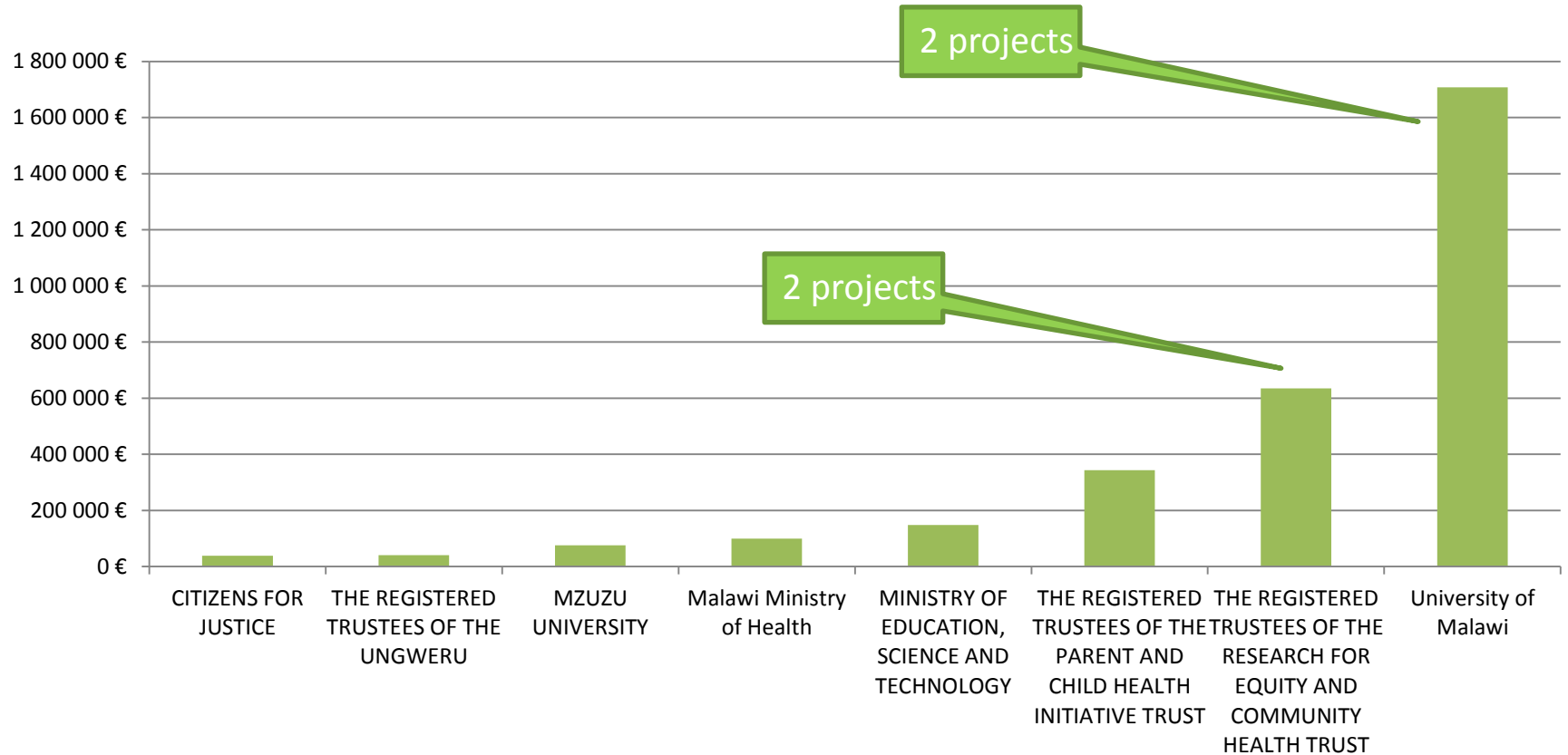

Most prominent Malawian Participants



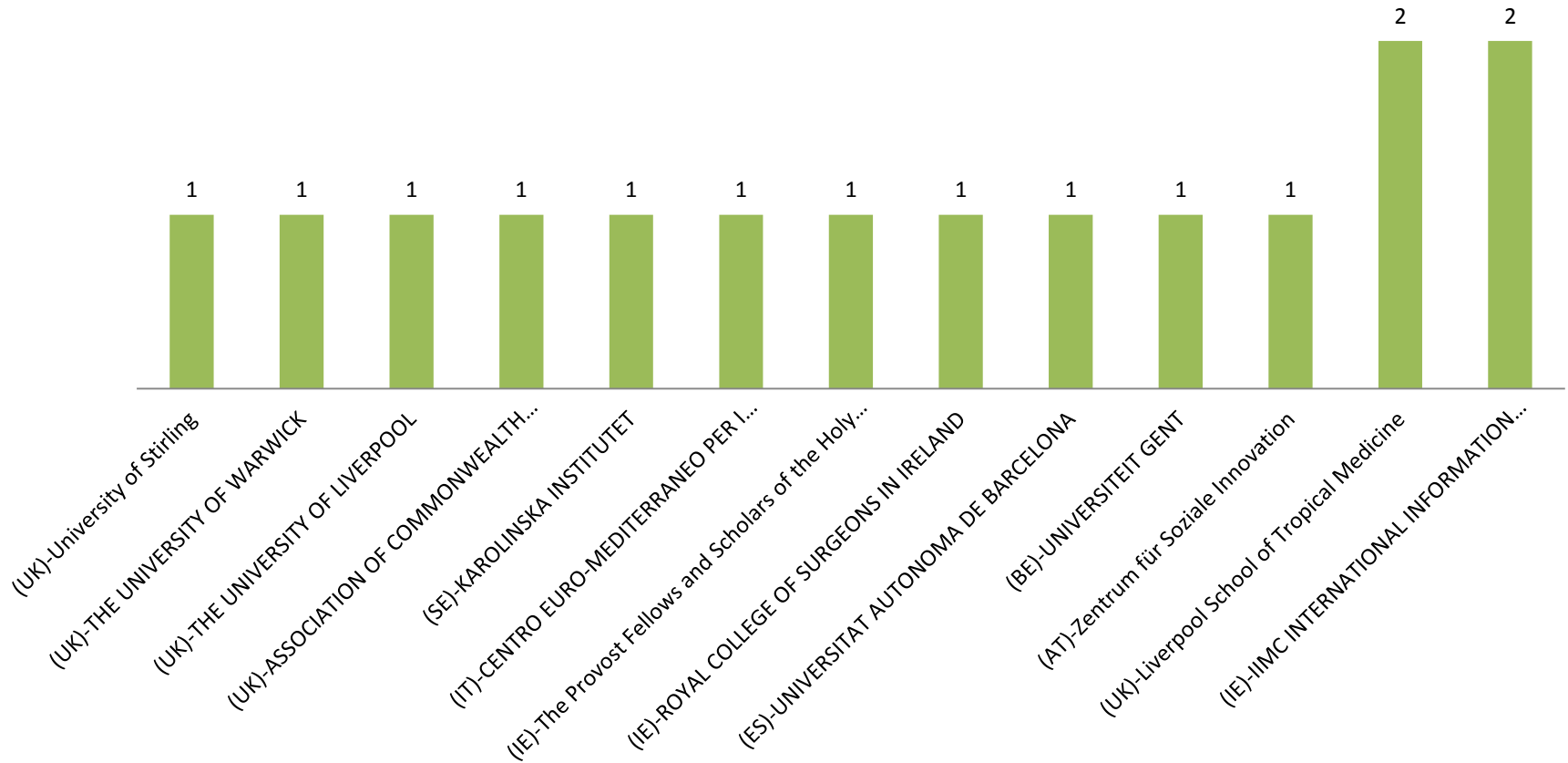

EC contribution for each Malawian Participant



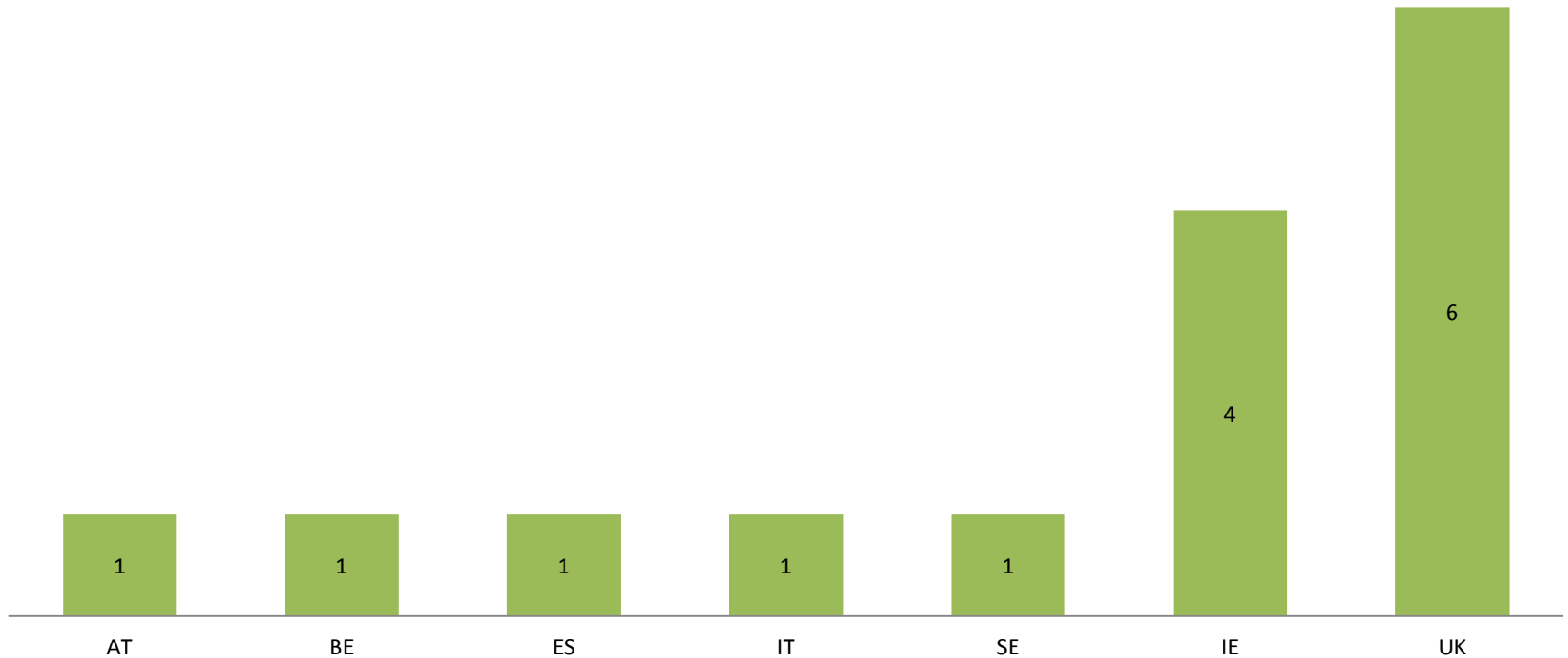

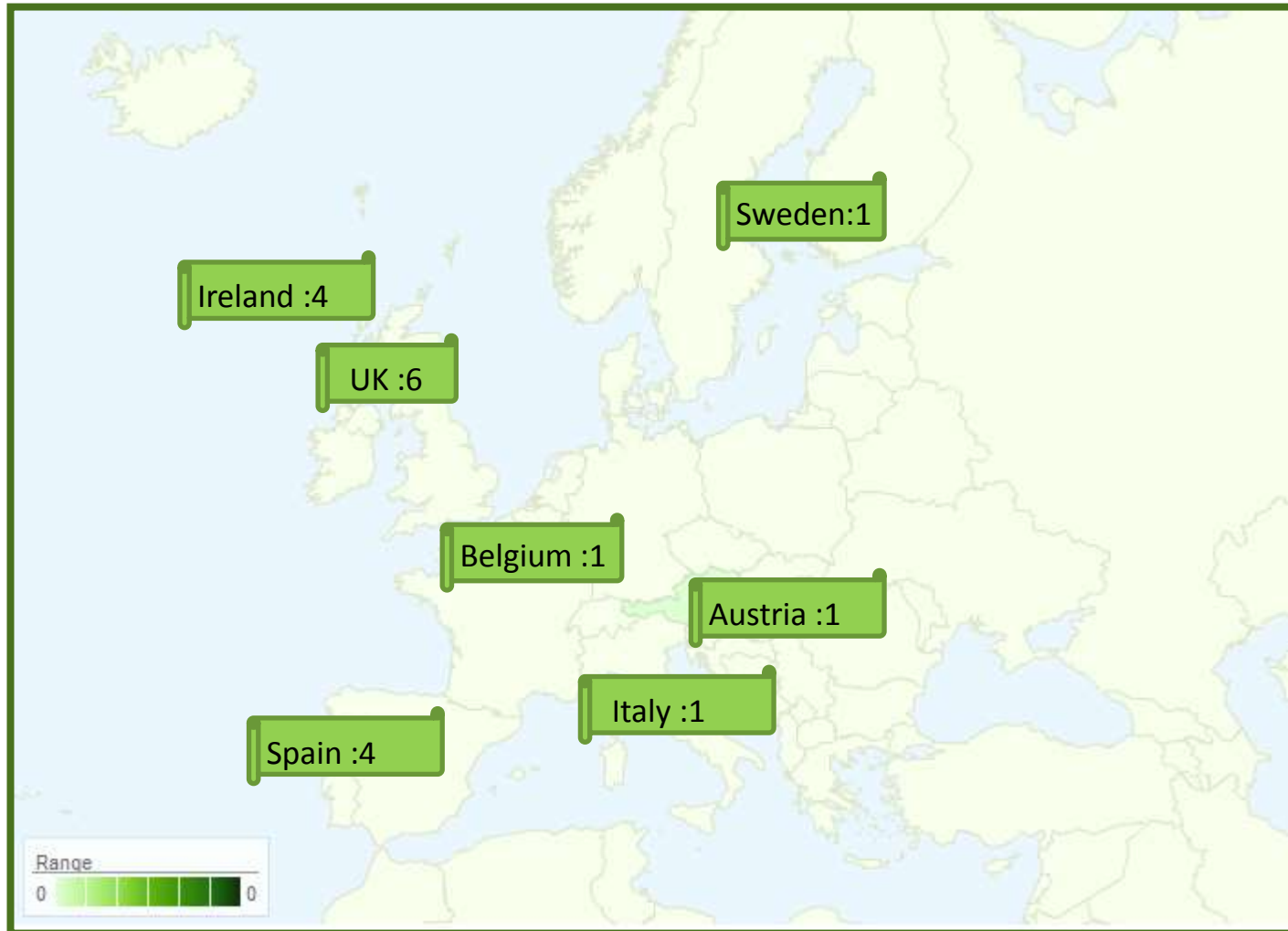

ETATMBA - Enhancing human resources and use of appropriate technologies for maternal and perinatal survival in Sub-Saharan Africa

Aim : to develop the education and training for Non-Physician Clinicians (NPCs) who work with mothers and babies in rural and urban areas of Africa.

- From February 2011 to July 2014 EU contribution of €2.6 million
- Led by the University of Warwick (UK) with 2 other European partners and 3 African partners including University of Malawi

REACHOUT - Reaching out and linking in: Health systems and close-to-community services

Aim: To work with well-respected and widely quoted close-to-community (CTC) services to identify how these can best be delivered and document generic lessons for system development and strengthening, in order to maximize the equity, effectiveness and efficiency of CTC services in rural and urban slum areas of the six participating countries.

- From February 2013 to January 2018
- EU contribution of €5.7 million
- Led by the Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine (UK) with 1 other European partner and 4 African partners including the Research for Equity and Community Health Trust (Malawi)
